
Dive into — the ocean

From Al Mouj Marina, yacht owners can set off into the sea and discover alluring islands and an abundance of marine life in some of the region's most prominent boating, fishing and diving destinations. Here is where you should go next:

1. Daymaniyat Island Nature Reserve

A string of 9 islands and around 15 nautical miles away lies the uninhabited Daymaniyat Islands, renowned for their coral reefs, reef fish, turtles and xrays. As Oman's only Marine Nature Reserve, special permits have to be acquired prior to a visit or a camping trip* and during May to October it is not permitted to go onto the islands, due to nesting birds and turtles.

2. Bandar Khayran Reserve

Located 30 nautical miles away from Al Mouj Marina, Bandar Khayran is the perfect place for divers. The reserve encompasses more than 22 diving locations, each with its own charm and beauty.

3. Al Fahal Island

Also known as 'Shark Island, this famous spot for diving and fishing is only 14 nautical miles from Al Mouj Marina.

Explore the island's:

- Deep reefs
- Diverse sample of sea life such as barracuda and giant eagle rays
- Lazing sharks on the shallower sandbanks (if you are lucky)

4. Musandam

Often described as 'The Norway of Arabia', Musandam peninsula boasts a magical combination of landscapes. From the town of Khasab, you can take a cruise through Khor ash Sham, Musandam's most spectacular fjord and enjoy the picturesque Khasab Castle. Do not forget to look out for the frolicking dolphins.

Protect --- our environment

Cleaning your boat is a must in order to keep it safe and reliable. As you do so, minimize the environmental impact this may cause by following tips listed below.

As a Clean Marina accredited facility, we always encourage boat owners to practice clean boating techniques.

Boat Operation

- Observe all rules and regulations including 'no wake' zones
- Avoid operating through shallow areas. You may risk damage to your boat and sensitive habitats
- Consider investing in a 4 stroke, efficient engine to save money on fuel and lessen the unused fuel released

Engine Maintenance

- Routine engine servicing is important. It is best to contact your dealer for maintenance
- Flush your engines with fresh water every time you use your boat
- If you must use solvents, use VOC-free solvents
- Use orange-pink coloured propylene radiator fluids/
 coolants, which are nontoxic to marine life

Fuelling

- Monitor fuel hose and filler point when fuelling
- Know how much fuel your tanks hold

- Always use an oil absorbent color or pad when fuelling to catch drips
- Prevent spills by not over filling and listening to filler pipe to anticipate when the tank is full
- Install a fuel/air separator or an air whistle in your tank line, or use a vent cup to capture overspill
- Add a stabilizer to your fuel if you use your boat infrequently to preserve fuel
- If you see a fuel spill, stop it at the source and contact the marina staff immediately
- Never pour oil or oily liquids into the water

Boat Cleaning

- Use soaps and solvents sparingly
- Avoid using harmful products near the sea
- Scrub your decks regularly with water to reduce the use of cleaners
- Do large cleaning and maintenance jobs out of the water
- Ask our team to dispose of your used zincs and anodes



Maintain — your assets

As a Clean Marina accredited facility, Al Mouj Marina encourages yacht owners to learn about and to use clean boating techniques.

Hull Maintenance

- Boat paints and other hull coatings contain
 harmful elements
- Use an anti-fouling paint if you plan on scrubbing the boat bottom in the water but remember, this is not allowed in the Marina
- Only pump out grey, black water and

contaminated bilge at available stations in the Marina

- Use biodegradable treatment chemicals
- Have your marine toilet inspected regularly
- Do not dispose of fats, solvents, oils, emulsifiers, disinfectants, paints, poisons, phosphates, nappies, or other in your marine toilet
- Use shore-side showers and laundry facilities when possible
- Use low nitrogen and phosphorous detergents for onboard cleaning

Garbage

- Put a sturdy trash container on your boat
- Do not toss garbage or plastics overboard
- Reduce the amount of packaging and plastic you take
 onboard
- Dispose of trash when you return to the Marina (our staff will help you). Store it securely so it does not fly away while boating

- Use the appropriately marked garbage receptacles. If a garbage can is full, ask our staff for help
- Separate recyclable materials
- Not sure how to dispose of a certain waste? ask our

Staff

- Never leave used oil unattended near a bin
- Be a good neighbor and pick up garbage you come across. You may call our staff to help

Fish Waste

- Fish waste should be discarded offshore
- Take particular care to properly dispose of fishing lines
- Practice catch and release techniques to ensure the survival of fish you toss back
- Use circle hooks
- Wet hands or wear gloves before handling fish



Follow — our marina checklist

Leaving the Marina

- Check fuel level
- Turn batteries on
- Check engine oil and coolant level
- Ensure air vent on tank is open
- Vent engine room using blower
- Ensure that engine is in neutral
- Check prop is clear

Test kill cord works

• Engage gears briefly to check operation

In the Marina

- Ensure you stick to the speed limits inside the Marina NO WAKE
- Follow the Marina navigational channel
- Be aware of local fishermen and watch out for nets near the breakwater
- If you need fuel, the station is located on the eastern side of the marina (starboard when leaving)

Re-entering the Marina

- Be aware that the southern entrance to the Marina is a blind spot. Make sure you approach the entrance cautiously with a wide angle.
- Be aware of wind direction, speed and weather conditions when mooring

- Our Marina staff will welcome you with mineral water
 and chilled towels
- Our dockmaster will assist with the following:
- Mooring, please contact the Marina for assistance -24h dockmaster on: +968 9639 2323
- Shore power connection
- Returning covers
- Flush and rinse engines with fresh water
- Off loading and transporting items and guests
- Transient Vessels
- For transient vessels visiting Omani waters there are entry and exit formalities.
- Vessels should appoint a licensed agent for handling:
- Safety inspection
- Immigration procedures
- Customs clearance
- Sailing permits and approvals
